When we hear of dog bites, especially in young children, it must be understood that our dogs may not speak our language, but they do communicate, it's just that we aren't listening.

Dogs feeling uncomfortable will: hide, shake, lip lick, yawn, tail tuck, turn away from you. So many times when a dog bites the owner says, "We never saw it coming!" That doesn't mean the signs weren't there. I would encourage every parent to make it part of your daily life to teach children how to approach a dog. When we are at the Shikellamy Park and meet children this is a good time to teach them the rules. Also we will be visiting the YMCA this month and I use this time to show children how to approach a dog.

How many times have you heard a dog get scolded for growling. We should be rewarding them. This is them shouting, loud and clear, "I'm, really unhappy right now, please stop". It is extremely rare for a dog to jump right into a bite mode without a sign, we just don't recognize it.

Do you remember when women in department stores used to walk up and spray you with perfume without asking first? They stopped because too many people were snapping at them. It's a kind of like that.

It takes time to teach children to respect animals. In some respects, kids comfortable with the family dog are at risk for bites, because they are used to approaching dogs who are comfortable with being handled and may not be familiar with strange dogs.

We teach children:

- 1. Use your EYES and see if the dog wants to be approached.
- 2. Use your MOUTH to ask permission.
- 3. Stand STILL and let the dog approach and sniff your hand.
- 4. Only then can you pat the dog gently on the side of the face or under the chin.
