# Old Friends by Connie Cuff



One of the key methods of training is to put your-self in your dog's position and try to see the world through his eyes.

In forming a relationship with your dog friendships are built on shared experiences and the development of mutual respect and trust. It is how you conduct yourself around your dog with confidence and authority using your voice sparingly and controlling emotions.

A dog doesn't have a sense of what words mean. He simply comes to understand through repetition and association that a set of sounds and actions are related to a behavior. They understand the tone and volume of your voice, how you are holding your body and the smallest of gestures you make. These make up only a small percentage of how dogs communicate with us and each other.

When dogs bring in information to process, their predominant sense is smell, followed by hearing and then sight. A dog's sense of smell is somewhere between 10,000 and 100,000 times as sensitive as our own. So, the next time you're walking your dog, remember that there's more out there for him to analyze than you can possibly sense.

It is common knowledge that dogs can hear sounds at a higher pitch than a human can detect and they can hear sounds that originate from a greater distance. Your dog isn't necessarily afraid of the vacuum cleaner, lawn mower or fireworks, they want to keep their distance because it is damaging his hearing or painful.

As for a dog's vision, his visual clarity is 20/75 compared to our 20/20. As a consequence he is less likely to recognize facial features at a distance and instead relies on seeing shape and has a superior ability to detect motion and body language. They also see best in low-light situations like dusk and dawn. This is the reason it is important in training to teach hand signals along with verbal clues.

In playing with your dog the object you want your dog to fetch should contrast with the background against which it will be visible.

The insight in how our dogs view the world and behave shows us their respectful appreciation and utilization of their capabilities.
