Lets decipher the way dogs express happiness.

Wagging tail - Does it indicate a happy dog? Not always. What it simply means is "I am ready to interact". Some wagging tails signal could mean I'm ready to bite. You can trust a wagging body but never a wagging tail. With the 'happy' tail wag comes the rear-end wag, shoulder wag and even a head wag. A dog who is considered aggressive will tend to hold his head high with a slower wag, stiff body and shift his weight forward.

We have the "play bow" - It is the ultimate gesture of friendliness from the dog's perspective. It is intended for playful interaction. A play face and smiling often accompany the play bow.

Then there is the "body wiggle" which is a green light and often accompanies a "play bow". Jumping, bouncing and running in jerky movements is an invite for play. At the dog park I see Cagney backing up to a dog with his welcome to play.

Two dogs may display different signs of happiness. As an example, an English Bull Dog is less able to make exaggerated facial expressions. Blood-hounds and Mastiffs express more with their eyes (check out Bo when he comes to class).

Jane Shaw, DVM at Colorado State Veterinary School claims the most expressive breeds are the Golden and Labrador Retrievers. "I'd definitely call them the 'Happiness Spokesdogs' for the species". (Cagney fits this category well)

Sharing happy moments with your dog is priceless but at some point you may need to interpret your dog's behavior. People who are around dogs should learn canine language and respect what a dog says - it's a safety issue for all who interact with dogs.

Keep this in mind when you come to class or visit a Dog Park. We need to read these behaviors correctly for the safety of ourselves and our dogs.

A note to those of you that use dried kibble for you dogs Dry food is packed with oils that go rancid with exposure to air. To keep dry food fresh, nutritious and safe:

Buy only the amount of food your dog eats in a month.

Check the bag's "best by" date and write down the date you open the bag.

Keep the food in its original packaging because it's engineered to retain freshness and protect nutrients. This is useful in case of a recall.

Roll the top of the bag down as tight as possible and clip it shut to minimize air exposure. Put the whole dog food bag into a container with an airtight seal for added freshness. Store food in a cool, dry place below 70 degrees F.
