

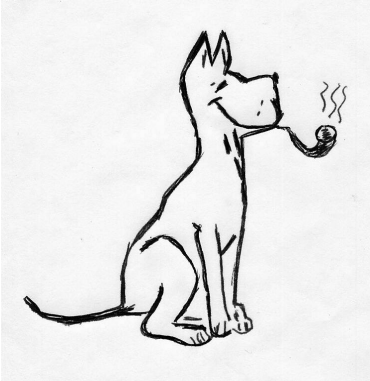

Old Friends

First, I want to thank everyone who participated in the Riverfest and the Northumberland County Expo, whether bringing their dog or supplying biscuits. People loved seeing our dogs and they did a good job in promoting therapy work.

Before giving your dog some food to eat, give him food for thought. Does your dog play with more of his food than he eats? Does he snatch a kibble or two and deposit it in an undisclosed location? Is he enthusiastic about treats yet uninterested in meals? It's more likely that your dog is hungrier for thought than for food.

Dogs are pack animals and eating is a necessary, daily pack ritual. Dogs whose jobs include carrying out tasks (sit, down, stay) for the people they live with become secure, working members of the family and eat well when food is used as a reward for carrying out these tasks. Dogs who are not required to work for their food tend to become insecure about their pack status, therefore becoming confused when they may or even should eat.

Feeding a meal to a dog for a job well done helps him feel that he has earned the meal. If you give food to your dog for free or leave it for him to eat when he pleases promotes confusion and fosters territorial as well as assertive behaviors. It's vital in the success of the human-dog relationship to remind your dog that you are the hand that feeds. If your dog chooses not to eat when you serve it, pick up the food and offer it later as a reward for completing another task.

Human food added to the dogs diet occasionally is okay. But most dog foods are nutritionally complete and one is bound to be a perfect fit for your dog's needs. If you need to modify the recipe, raw vegetables and some fruits make wonderful treats.

Don't serve a meal to your dog just before you leave the house. Dogs often feel stressed when left behind, so if a meal is offered just before you head out the door the dog learns to treat the meal as a sure signal of departure.

Try to begin the day with a long walk, mix in some obedience commands before feeding, and allow time for him to finish the meal before you dash off for the day. Your dog will become more enthusiastic about his well-earned meal and he'll be too tired to stress about you leaving.

This may require setting your alarm a little earlier but the walk is not only good for your dog but you as well. Think of the calories that you both are burning and it will help the two of you to slim down.

Your dog will love the walk and you will establish an alpha relationship with your best friend.

Lydia Storey sent me an article on pet insurance. Many companies are claiming to offer pet insurance when they are really offering a discount veterinary plan. With pet insurance you will select a plan and have a deductible. and a certain percentage of veterinary expenses you are responsible for. For example if an operation cost \$2,000 and your deductible was \$250 and the coverage rate was 80/20, you would be responsible for \$600 and your insurance company would pay \$1400. If you had a vet discount policy you would need to take your pet to a participating vet and you would receive 25% off your bill. In this case that would be \$1500. So there is a difference.

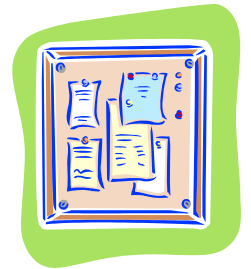
